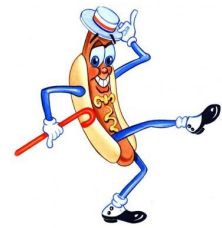

Public Notices

Township Code states that only newspapers that are printed for the general public may be used for publishing notices for the township. Since the Globe Leader no longer prints their newspaper, please refer to the Sharon Herald for any notices from the township, including meeting notices. As always, anytime a meeting is scheduled, a notice is placed on the window of the door to the township building for residents' reference.

New Equipment

This year, the Township was able to purchase a used grader as well as a road broom attachment for the tractor. This will enable the supervisors and employees to grade the gravel roads and ditch along township roads.



Sewer Update

The Board of Supervisors, secretary, and the township's sewer planning engineer are working together to complete the Act 537 Plan to be resubmitted to PA Dept. of Environmental Protection for their review before any designs can begin. Once the Plan is reviewed and accepted by DEP, designs and costs can be established. This has been a lengthy and slow process. The start date of this project is still planned for the spring of 2015 with the completion at the end of 2015. Thank you to each of you within the sewer project for your patience! Please remember, this project does not extend to the entire township. It is limited to all of Valley View Road, Willow Drive, and Auction Road; Bethel Road from the Borough to Willow Drive; Cowden Road from Bethel Road for about 1 mile length; and Mercer-New Wilmington Road from the Borough to Dollar General.

Landlord Registration Forms

Recently, a letter had been sent to all residents in Wilmington Township regarding landlords registering their tenants with the township. If you are not a landlord, whether at your primary residence or another property within Wilmington Township, you need do nothing. However, if you are a landlord, you should have sent in the required form to the township already. If you have not done so, please take the time to do this right away.

The requirements of registering your tenants are as follows:

An updated registration form must be made out at the beginning of each year, and again within 30 days of new tenants moving in. Forms will be mailed out to landlords at the beginning of each new year. If you need additional forms or have any questions, please contact the township office.

Road Report

So far this year part of Bend Road, Garrett Road and Anderson Road have been ditched. East Branch Road has been graded and is holding up nicely.

Bend Road and **Orchard Road** will receive a superpave leveling course and seal coat. A portion of **Indian Run Road** will be seal coated.

USDA Home Repair Loan and Grant Program

The 504 Loan and Grant Program allows eligible income rural homeowners with very low income to repair or improve a home through water/sewer hookups, removing health or safety hazards, installing energy efficient windows/doors and heating/cooling systems.

USDA Rural Development recognizes the home repair needs of eligible rural homeowners. With a 1% interest rate, the 504 loan (up to \$20,000), the 504 Grant (up to \$7500) or a loan and grant combination assist very-low income and other income eligible rural homeowners to make vital repairs. Applicants must have adjusted household incomes below the very low-income limits listed on the web site and be able to show repayment ability for the loan requested. The 504 Grant Program is available exclusively to very-low-income rural seniors aged 62 or older.

The deadline to file for this fiscal year is September 30, 2013; however, you may apply anytime after this date as well and be placed on a waiting list.

Then, under Housing and Community Facilities Grant Assistance, click Rural Housing Repair and Rehabilitation Grants. If you are looking for a loan, click Loans on the left side of the page. Then, under Housing and Community Facilities Loan Assistance, click Rural Housing Repair and Rehabilitation Loans. You may also call 717-237-2186 for more information.

Safety Update for Natural Gas or Propane Supply Lines

Lt. Governor Jim Cawley and State Fire Commissioner Ed Mann recently announced an effort to raise awareness regarding a safety upgrade for grounding existing (and new) yellow corrugated stainless steel tubing used to supply natural gas or propane to appliances in homes and offices. There has been an upgrade to the grounding installation requirements due to the risk of fires resulting from pinhole leaks in the tubing that can occur as a result of a lightning strike.

As a state prone to lightning strikes, TEMA and PSATS encourages its member townships to share this information with their residents as a means to further provide for the protection of the health, welfare, and safety of your residents.

Property owners who have yellow CSST installed in their homes after 1989 should contact a licensed electrical contractor to determine proper bonding of the system. As always, consumers should consider qualifications of the contractor before selecting them to perform a safety check.

Although yellow CSST installations may have met code requirements at the time of installation, safety building codes have changed and it is now recommended that these systems be promptly checked and updated to the new installation standards.

DOG LICENSES

Dogs 3 months and older are required to be licensed. Licenses are issued on the calendar year. Mercer County residents can obtain a license at the township office.
