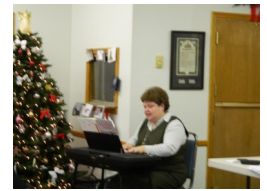


## Civic League Annual Christmas Party

## The Year in Review

The Civic League had a very successful year in 2012. Donations from the Civic League were given to the Lawrence County Crisis Shelter, Hometown Heroes, Amish Benefit Auction, Kiwanis Halloween Parade, New Wilmington VFD Auction, Victory Christian Center, Andy Byler to aid in rebuilding after the fire, Westminster Fireworks, the township for a pressure washer, and several other donations to others in need.

The league held monthly meetings with many interesting speakers and topics, including Dr. Joe Raught and his guest Cecil Neely, Nancy Bergey from the New Castle Crisis Center, Brenda Swogger and Sharon Henry from Penn State master gardeners, and District Attorney Robert Kochems.

The league raised over \$1400 at the May garage sale, along with a quilt raffle, lunch and doughnut sales. The Rabies Clinic in April brought \$672 and approximately \$3800 was raised at the Corn Roast Auction, where donated merchandise, produce, baked goods, certificates, hand crafted items, and much more were auctioned off.

Two \$750 scholarships were awarded to Mackenzie Hiers and Morgan Ferrell.

The Civic League helped finance the monthly senior luncheons. Our veterans were honored at the November luncheon which hosted Mr. Tom Stanton, who is the current Mayor of Wheatland. Mr. Stanton is a Korean and Vietnam War Veteran that was honored at the Mercer Memorial Day 500.

## New Lane Names

New lane names will be ready to use very soon for residents who received letters in 2010. Be watching your mail for a letter informing you of your new address. Anyone with an address change must use this new address when contacting emergency services. Emergency services will have your new address only in their GPS system.



## House Numbers

In an emergency, seconds count. Precious time can be wasted trying to locate an unmarked house. Help your local emergency service providers by displaying your house number.

House numbering signs are available at the township office for \$10.00. Get yours before an emergency happens!

## Sewer Project

There has been a lot of confusion as to where the sewer project is taking place and who is paying for the project. The project includes Auction Road, a portion of Bethel Road from Cowden Road to and including Willow Drive, Mercer-New Wilmington Road from the Borough to approximately Dollar General, Valley View Drive, and Cowden Road from Bethel Road for about a mile stretch.

Only residents that are receiving public sewer on these roads will be paying for their portion of the project. If you live outside of these areas, you will not be affected by the sewer project.

The Act 537 Plan for the sewer project has been submitted to DEP for review and approval. Once this process has been completed, the design phase of the project will begin.

## Work done on Township Grounds



The supervisors and employees have worked hard to accomplish many projects this year including: painting the township building/garage, replacing a township door and garage man doors, cleaning out the garage and the township grounds, and painting the doors and shutters. Thank you to everyone who helped with these projects!

## What's in the Budget?

The 2013 Budget had been approved by the supervisors at the December meeting. The 2013 budget will include replacing a culvert on Means Road out of the general fund and a back hoe/attachments in the amount of \$12,000 out of the capital preservation fund. Indian Run Road is being considered for sections of paving and seal coating in addition to seal coating all of Angel Road. Expenses to complete this entire road project exceeds the state fund income, therefore \$61,000 will be allotted from the state fund and \$10,000 was budgeted through the general fund to complete the project





## New multi-year fishing licenses now available



For the first time, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) is selling 3-year and 5-year fishing licenses. The PFBC is offering a number of rewards exclusively for customers who buy a multi-year license, including a free online subscription to Pennsylvania Angler and Boater magazine and various offers from popular retailers.

A 3-year fishing license is valid through 2015 and a 5-year license is valid through 2017. Customers who buy multi-year licenses save money by not having to pay transaction and processing fees each year. For example, a customer who buys a 5-year license will save \$6.80. Anglers can also purchase multi-year trout/salmon, Lake Erie and combo permits and experience similar savings. ## 2013 Dog Licenses are Now Available



This is a reminder that all dog owners need to purchase an annual dog license. State law requires that all dogs three months and older be licensed each year. Pennsylvania dog licenses for 2013 are now available at the township office. Purchasing a dog license can be one of the most beneficial things you can do to aid in protecting man's best friend.

## Electronics Recycling Event

As of January 1, 2013 NO PERSON MAY PLACE IN MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE A COVERED DEVICE OR ANY OF ITS COMPONENTS. Pennsylvania passed the Covered Device Recycling Act in late 2010 (Act 108). This is a disposal ban that means residents cannot put out covered devices with their trash and haulers cannot accept these items for any type of disposal. New Wilmington Borough will hold a collection day for these devices. Please only bring items listed.

**WHERE:** NEW WILMINGTON BOROUGH MAINTENANCE GARAGE Located at: 155 Maple St. [behind Westminster football field]

**WHEN:** JANUARY 26, 8:00 A.M UNTIL 10:00 A.M. ONLY. DO NOT DROP OFF ITEMS PRIOR TO THE EVENT OR AFTER THE EVENT. AN APPROVED HAULER (E-LOOP) WILL COLLECT THESE ITEMS AND HAUL THEM AWAY THE SAME MORNING.

- Printers and Copiers

## DOG LICENSES

DOGS 3 MONTHS AND OLDER ARE REQUIRED TO BE LICENSED. LICENSES ARE ISSUED ON THE CALENDAR YEAR. MERCER COUNTY RESIDENTS CAN OBTAIN A LICENSE AT THE TOWNSHIP OFFICE.



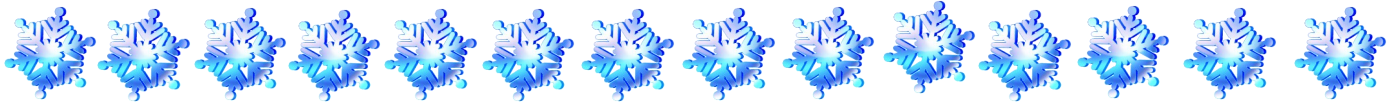
